New Test Sequence Policy

The NBPME will, beginning on January 1, 2010, NOT allow any podiatric medical student or candidate to take Part II unless he or she has taken and successfully completed (with a passing score) Part I. Likewise, we will NOT allow any candidate to take Part III unless he/she has successfully completed and passed Part I and II. We will mandate that the tests be taken sequentially and passed before the candidate continues on to the next part. The goal of this new policy is to require students to demonstrate mastery of basic knowledge before advancing into clinical knowledge and skills assessment, since each test part assumes that prior knowledge has been achieved.

The NBPME's new test sequence policy shall not apply to or affect candidates who have taken any NBPME exam (whether Part I, Part II or Part III) prior to January 1, 2010.

NBPME's Website

NBPME maintains an informational website that provides answers to your frequently asked questions. Candidate bulletins, exam registration forms, practice tests, score transfer forms and a tutorial are all of some of the items available at the site. Please visit the site at www.nbpme.com.

Promteric

NBPME operations were transitioned to Prometric's call center in St. Paul, Minnesota in July, 2008. With 20 trained operators available to assist candidates during normal business hours, the wait time and unanswered calls have significantly decreased from prior years. Candidates may call toll free (877-302-8952) from 7am – 6pm (Central) with their questions and inquiries. If a candidate calls after hours, they will be instructed to call back during normal business hours and will be unable to leave a message.

Strategic Initiatives

Clinical Skills Examination

During NBPME's Mid-Winter meeting, March 21st, Drs. Thomas Rebbecchi and Allyson Lehrman from the National Board of Medical Examiners presented a summary of the elements of their clinical skills examination. Members from our Board and a member from AACPM will visit NBME to further consider a clinical skills examination for Podiatric Medicine.

Part III Transition

The Board approved the recently completed practice analysis for Part III. The content to be tested will change from entry level to the completion of one-year of residency training. An implementation date has not been established. That process will be developed with State Boards, our testing contractor (Prometric) and NBPME.
